The Paris Climate System's annual Conference of the Parties serves as an indicator on the state of global climate action. COP27 in Egypt in November, 2022 showed that a prerequisite for further progress will be development of systems for funding reductions in greenhouse gas emissions and adaptation to climate change threats in developing countries, as well as responding to those countries' demands for climate reparations from developed countries. After a survey of the current state of the world's climate, the course will focus on the challenges posed by climate finance and proposed solutions.
